### 1. 17-1: New England Connected Automated Vehicles

- A follow-up web meeting was held on Nov. 16. A second face-to-face meeting is planned for Jan. 29 or 31.
- Emily said the in-person meeting date will likely be the 31<sup>st</sup>. Further details are forthcoming but she said it will be held in Concord at the NHDOT. Some people in attendance will be planning staff from DOTs and TSMO, as well as other DOT staff.

### 2. 14-2: Investigation of Northern Long-Eared Bat Roosting Sites on Bridges

• Equipment (acoustic sensors) are being distributed among the New England DOTs. The infrared camera will remain in storage at UMass as it is a more central location for people to borrow from.

#### 3. NETC Fund Balance Update (No change since last meeting)

- CT and RI have left over travel funds, \$19,021.02 and \$12,593.53 respectively. CT plans to use some of theirs to attend TRB.
- NETC "unallocated" balance as of July 31, 2018 \$102,759.89
